APWA Board Member Affirmation Process is now open.

May 15 marks the start of the final stage to select members of the APWA Board Directors for the President-Elect, Director-at-Large for Fleet and Facilities, and Region I, II, V, VI and VIII Director positions. Since there will be only one candidate on the ballot along with the ability to write in another candidate, we have begun to call the process an "affirmation" rather than an election. By participating in this online process, members are validating the work of the National and Regional Nominating Committees who carefully reviewed the qualifications, experience, and suitability of each candidate before making their selection. The affirmation closes June 12, 2019.

Government Affairs

During National Public Works Week, APWA Government Affairs will be hosting two events on Capitol Hill in conjunction with the House Public Works and Infrastructure Caucus. On May 21, there will be a roundtable breakfast for Congressional Members and staff to hear from APWA members about public works and the workforce. Then on May 23, we will host our annual "Donuts and Trucks" event in partnership with the D.C. Department of Public Works. These two events bring opportunities for Congress to learn more about APWA and National Public Works Week, as well as our public policy priorities: Transportation, Water Resiliency, and Emergency Management and Response.

APWA Government Affairs has organized a work group comprised of a few APWA members from the Government Affairs Committee (GAC) and the Transportation Technical Committee to review the current [Fixing America's Surface Transportation \(FAST\) Act \(Public Law 114-94\)](#). The FAST Act expires in September 2020, and though APWA has a Transportation public policy statement, it was determined by the GAC that a separate and in-depth review of current law was needed and developing a statement specifically for reauthorization to communicate APWA's requests to Congress and the Trump Administration for the next surface transportation reauthorization law would be beneficial. The work group is meeting by conference call every three weeks to draft a new policy statement. That draft will be reviewed and, hopefully, approved by the APWA Board of Directors during their meeting at PWX in Seattle in September.

On May 7, APWA Government Affairs Manager Marty Williams attended a 2019 Hill Watch policy event featur-

ing Senator Bill Cassidy (R-LA) and Representative Scott Peters (D-CA).

On May 15, APWA Government Affairs Media Manager Emily Dowsett served as a panel judge for the American Association of Port Authorities 2019 Communications Awards Program.

On May 16, APWA Associate Nahid Paiman and APWA Director of Government Affairs Andrea Eales attended a seminar on "Workers and the Innovation Age." The event is being hosted by [The Hill](#), a political newspaper and website.

The APWA Government Affairs team is looking to expand the Advocacy Ambassadors program. The program originated from the Advocacy Task Force under the Council of Chapters. Advocacy Ambassadors is intended to build a network of APWA members who advocate on behalf of the organization at the local, state, and federal levels. We are working to identify an Ambassador in each US APWA chapter, and are looking for interested members. Please spread the word to all APWA members. The most substantial of these are the Technical Committees that deal with specific public works areas. APWA Technical Committees are the “centers of expertise” for the assigned subject areas, and their primary purpose is to provide direction and oversight to programs, services and products within the technical area of expertise in support of the strategic plan and APWA goals and objectives.

Technical Committees are responsible for articles in every issue of the *Reporter*, PWX/Snow Conference presentations, Click, Listen & Learn webinars, APWA Publications, and supporting APWA Certification programs for Fleet, Stormwater, Construction Inspection, and Public Works Supervision and Management.

Technical Committee Mission Statements:

Asset Management Committee

To support APWA members that operate, improve and maintain public works and infrastructure through advocacy, education, resource development, and member engagement in the field of asset management.

Emergency Management Committee

To provide APWA members with resources and a forum for exchanging and developing ideas, knowledge, and technologies for mitigating from, preparing for, responding to, and recovery from all hazards (manmade and natural disasters). The committee also intends to foster recognition of public works' important role(s) in emergency management.

Engineering and Technology Committee

Solid Waste Management Committee
